17. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

The university hosts four interdisciplinary research centres that offer Ph.D. programs and specialized training, fostering innovation and societal development. The Centre for Adivasi Studies and Museum (CASM) focuses on empowering tribal students through higher education and research in tribal literature, art, and culture. Its museum preserves rare tribal artefacts, serving as a valuable resource for cultural studies. The Centre for Life Sciences is a multidisciplinary hub encompassing departments like Botany, Zoology, Human Physiology, Microbiology, Biomedical Laboratory Sciences, and Fishery Sciences. It conducts extensive research and organizes training programs on biological instruments and advanced techniques, enhancing scientific expertise. The Centre for Environmental Studies (CES) addresses pressing environmental issues by promoting education, research, and awareness. It equips researchers with essential knowledge and skills through training programs aimed at sustainable environmental management. The Women's Studies Centre advocates for gender equity by exploring issues related to women, feminism, and gender studies. It supports research on women's development and organizes capacity-building programs for faculty and women from various sectors, fostering empowerment. Together, these centres provide a dynamic platform for multidisciplinary research, education, and training, contributing to academic excellence and addressing critical societal challenges. Apart from these centres, the departments are also engaged in interdisciplinary research.

18. Academic bank of credits (ABC):

The university actively promotes the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) system to enhance student mobility across higher education institutions. This initiative allows students to accumulate and transfer credits for prior learning experiences, fostering flexibility in academic pursuits. Currently, over 4 lakh undergraduate and postgraduate student accounts with credit data have been created under the ABC system. Students can easily create their ABC ID by logging into DigiLocker and following a few simple, customized steps. To facilitate this process, detailed instructions and the required links have been provided on the university website. Additionally, awareness videos released by national education and administrative authorities have been uploaded to the website to encourage students to utilize this system. Through the ABC system, credits earned in one program at an institution can be transferred

or redeemed at another institution with the student's consent, enabling seamless academic progression. The university views credit transfer as a vital element of successful study mobility. As a result of these efforts, nearly all postgraduate students at the university have completed their ABC ID registration, further integrating the ABC framework into the academic ecosystem.

19.Skill development:

The university is deeply committed to fostering skill development through a variety of initiatives, led by departments such as Remote Sensing, Geography, Computer Science, Applied Mathematics, Botany (offers beekeeping), and the Life Sciences Centre, all of which focus on equipping students with advanced practical skills. Additionally, the Computer Centre (offers Data Science), National Service Scheme (NSS), University Science Instrumentation Centre (USIC), Office of the Dean of Student Welfare (offers yoga), Sports Department, Fishery Sciences Department, and the Language Laboratory contribute to skill enhancement programs. These efforts benefit not only enrolled students but also local youth from nearby villages. A notable example is the NSS-led training on mushroom cultivation and vermicomposting, which promotes sustainable livelihood opportunities for the surrounding community. Each academic department complements theoretical learning with skill development programs tailored to their specific disciplines. For instance, language departments emphasize language proficiency and soft skills, while the Women's Studies Centre offers training in areas such as soft toy preparation, Gahana bodi, and life skills, including Karate. Additionally, the Human Physiology department organized a health-wellness awareness program. These programs are designed to ensure that students are well-equipped for both academic excellence and practical, real-world applications.

20.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

Indian knowledge systems (IKS), including Ayurveda, Yoga, Vedanta, Jyotish, and others, have been preserved and practised for generations. However, these traditions are yet to be fully integrated into mainstream education and healthcare. A significant challenge in this integration is the lack of comprehensive scientific evidence to support their efficacy. While practices like Ayurveda and Yoga have some anecdotal and scientific backing, further research is crucial to establish their benefits and limitations. To address this, university faculty adjust their teaching approaches to cater to the diverse linguistic and cultural backgrounds of students from various Indian communities. Language

diversity and cultural variety are prioritized during syllabus development. The course content, particularly in the language and social science departments—such as Sanskrit, Santali, Hindi, Bengali, and English, also the Physiology department offers courses on IKS—reflects the university's commitment to promoting Indian knowledge systems. Furthermore, the university offers online courses in these subjects to enhance accessibility and increase awareness of these rich traditions, ensuring that students can engage with and learn about these systems of knowledge in a modern educational context. Also, the University has designed the syllabus of two independent courses for the students of Science and Arts & Humanities faculties.

21. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

Outcome-Based Education (OBE) is an educational framework designed to establish clear, measurable learning outcomes for students while aligning teaching and assessment strategies to achieve these objectives. The primary goal of OBE is to prepare students with the knowledge, skills, and competencies necessary for successful careers and personal development. In an OBE system, university faculty, in collaboration with select administrative officers, define specific learning outcomes for each course and program. These outcomes outline what students are expected to know, understand, and accomplish by the end of their studies. Examples of measurable objectives include "students will be able to explain the scientific method" or "students will be able to solve specific types of problems." Every course within a program is structured around these predefined outcomes. To support students in achieving these goals, faculty employ a variety of teaching methods, such as blackboard and PowerPoint lectures, group discussions, field trips, projects, and problem-based learning. Student progress is assessed through class tests, quizzes, assignments, seminars, and presentations. By focusing on measurable skills and competencies, OBE ensures that students are not only academically proficient but also well-equipped for professional and personal growth.

22. Distance education/online education:

The University's Distance Education program, now known as the Centre for Distance and Online Education (CDOE), has been in operation for over 30 years. However, due to not meeting certain criteria required to continue offering CDOE programs, admissions to CDOE courses have been paused. Despite the halt in admissions, the staff and faculty members remain actively employed. Currently, no students are enrolled in these programs, yet we are inputting "1" in relevant fields where data entry does not accept a zero.

Job-Oriented Courses

Vocational offerings, like Communicative English, Human Rights, E-Waste Management, AI, etc. provide students with practical skills having industry relevance.

Local

Public health, Fisheries Management, Nutrition, etc. meet the needs, addressing the area's unique industrial and societal needs.

Regional

Issues related to preservation and produce of forest, biodiversity, fish movement in coastal waters, weather-forecasting for fishermen and farmers, are addressed in the courses

National

Aligned with India's development priorities, programs include disaster-management, rural and tribal development, social service, etc.

Global

The university's globally-significant courses, including Environment Science, Community Health, Fuzzy Mathematics, etc. connect students with international educational networks.

Learning Outcome-Based Curriculum Framework (LOCF)

University has adopted Outcome-Based Education model as per UGC's LOCF. This learner-centric approach promotes digital literacy, ethical awareness, and lifelong learning, measured through well-

2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organises special Programmes/ have policies in place for different levels of learners

Primary categorization at the intake level in the respective PG courses is done through scores at the undergraduate level. The students admitted from the First List of candidates are initially considered as 'Advanced Learners'; whereas the same from the subsequent lists of candidates are initially considered as 'Slow Learners'. The psychometric test is conducted a month after admission to determine the students' level of receptivity. The first Internal Assessment (after six weeks of the beginning of the semester) identifies the Advanced and Slow learners based on their performances. Special tutorial / remedial classes and counselling are offered for slow learners. One class/week is assigned for the Departmental Library in which the mentors guide the slow learners. Various programmes for advanced learners are undertaken through schemes for entry in services, like coaching for SET/ NET/GATE/TOEFL/GRE examinations. For both advanced and slow learners, lectures from experts are regularly arranged, recorded and uploaded to the e-learning portal.

- Learners extend outreach services like community health checkup and children's education to villagers. They design projects to help neighbors so that university and its hinterland grow a sense of reciprocal familiarity between themselves. The teaching-learning process at Vidyasagar University has been realigned and redefined in the light of recent advances in ICT, to

make it easier to implement all types of educational learning theories and delivery models that support and encourage innovative teaching and learning modalities, both for theoretical and lab-based courses.

Post Covid-19 faculties were obliged to learn, implement, and use ICT-enabled tools. The faculty use ICT enabled classrooms with LCD projectors, Wi-Fi connectivity, software, PowerPoint presentations developed by teachers to expose the students to advanced knowledge and practical learning.

The University has a Learning Management System (LMS) that encompasses the majority of the teaching and learning process elements. It includes a variety of content management tools and systems that enable 'anytime, anywhere' access. In addition to the institutional LMS, faculty members can use MOODLE, an open source educational software that has been adapted specifically for teaching-learning infrastructure management and administration.

Also, the university has purchased G-suite through which relevant tools can be used for online teaching. The university has its own official YouTube channel for dissemination of digital contents and live classes.

3.1 - Promotion of Research and Facilities

3.1.1 - The institution Research facilities are frequently updated and there is well defined policy for promotion of research which is uploaded on the institutional website and implemented

Vidyasagar University has a state-of-the-art centralized instrumentation facility (USIC) to provide access to sophisticated laboratory instruments for faculty, staff, and research students to foster high-end multidisciplinary research and optimizing resource sharing. Facilities are upgraded frequently. Training and workshops are organized for efficient use of new instruments and technologies. Access of these facilities are granted to affiliated colleges and external researchers at nominal fees to promote collaboration and revenue generation. University allocates annual maintenance grant of Rs. 9.5 lakh, with Rs. 3 crore allocated (Rs. 1 crore from the State Government and Rs. 2 crores from UGC grants) for equipment and laboratory upgradation. The University's research policy aims to promote a quality research environment with strong adherence to ethical standards and to contribute effectively in Vikshit Bharat 2047. Faculty are supported through Personal research grant, Start-up, travel grants, registration fee reimbursements, and logistical support for obtaining external research funding. University research and publication awards with monetary incentives and Research-Club membership certificates (Platinum, Gold, Silver clubs) are introduced to promote competitiveness. Departmental journals, five of which are UGC-CARE-listed, receive financial assistance. Plagiarism check certificates are mandatory for Ph.D. thesis submission to ensure ethical compliance, that reflects the University's commitment towards research excellence.

Vidyasagar University fosters a robust ecosystem for innovation, research, and incubation, characterized by state-of-the-art infrastructure and knowledge dissemination. Faculty members, research scholars, and PG students engage actively in cutting-edge research and innovation, including research projects and field visits.

To encourage multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary research, the university has established four research centres and departments,

alongside an Incubation Centre aimed at skill and entrepreneurship development for both on-campus and nearby rural communities. The Centre also nurtures the idea and gives it a shape of a sustainable venture i.e., assisting from the stage of project identification to project implementation. It provides mentoring in all areas like operations, technical, finance, marketing, economics, etc. and acts as a support system by providing all sorts of assistance like infrastructure, technical expertise, market linkage, networking, etc. It has imparted training to promote rural entrepreneurship through hands-on demonstration in areas such as ornamental fish farming, bee-keeping, and vermicomposting.

The university organizes lecture programmes selectively by in-house teachers and outside experts to showcase the latest research on different disciplines.

The university has its own publication division which publishes research project outcomes and other writings in form of books and monographs as another effective tool of transfer of knowledge.

3.6 - Extension Activities

3.6.1 - Extension activities in the neighbourhood community in terms of impact and sensitising students to social issues and holistic development during the year

The university has undertaken extensive outreach programs aimed at fostering community development, public health awareness, and environmental conservation. Various health camps, including free dental, eye check-ups, and thalassemia detection, were organized in collaboration with Paschim Midnapore Zilla Swasthya Bhawan. Dengue, malaria, and vector-borne disease awareness campaigns were conducted, along with village cleaning drives to promote hygiene.

Yoga training sessions were provided to village children and NSS volunteers to enhance physical and mental well-being. Special initiatives included nutritional assessment camps, legal awareness programs for women, and surveys on endangered languages and cultures in indigenous communities. Environmental activities such as plantation drives, anti-hunting awareness campaigns, and ecosystem studies of the Kansabati River Basin emphasized sustainability. Community-oriented programs like goat and poultry farming training, mushroom cultivation workshops, and low-cost healthy food preparation sessions were held to encourage self-sufficiency. The university also played a role in national initiatives like Har Ghar Tiranga, Meri Maati Mera Desh, and Swachhata Hi Seva. NSS winter and adventure camps in remote areas, along with academic-industry and NGO linkages, further reinforced social engagement. These activities reflect the university's commitment to holistic development, empowering communities through education, health, and environmental stewardship.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The institution has adequate facilities for teaching - learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment, etc.

Spread over 138.78 acres, the University offers a modern smart campus with state-of-the-art facilities to support teaching, learning, research, and administration. It includes 82 classrooms, 109 laboratories, 14 seminar halls, ample office spaces, and various amenities for students. Among the classrooms, 78 are equipped with ICT tools, including 13 smart and virtual classrooms. Advanced laboratory infrastructure features equipment like NMR, Raman, X-ray diffractometer, GC-MS, UV-Vis-NIR, PL, HPLC, TCSPC, DLS, chemical vapor deposition, and electrochemical workstations, alongside desktops, laptops, and servers. A University Learning Management System enhances the teaching-learning experience, while the fully Wi-Fi-enabled campus allows access via smartphones, laptops, and desktops.

The secure campus is enclosed by boundary walls and monitored round

the clock with security guards and CCTV cameras. The academic-administrative area houses academic departments, the Centre for Distance and Online Education, the Centre for Continuing Adult Education (CCAE), interdisciplinary research centres, a library, a computer centre, administrative offices, canteens, an auditorium, and a sports and cultural complex. These facilities comply with the academic and administrative standards set by statutory bodies such as the UGC and AICTE, ensuring a comprehensive environment for academic excellence and institutional growth.

The university boasts state-of-the-art sports facilities catering to a variety of games, both indoors and outdoors. Indoor Facilities include a Gymnasium, Badminton Courts, Table Tennis, Chess, and Yoga & Meditation. Outdoor Facilities encompass a Multi-sports complex, playgrounds for outdoor sports such as Football, Cricket, and Athletics, as well as dedicated courts for Volleyball, Kabaddi, Kho-Kho, and Basketball. The university actively encourages student participation in both indoor and outdoor sports throughout the year. The Department of Student Welfare (DSW) and the Sports Officer oversee the maintenance and expansion of these facilities for students and staff.

Every year, the DSW and Sports Officer organize a variety of sports and games activities, including participation in East Zone & All India Inter-University Tournaments, for students from the university and affiliated colleges.

4.1.3 - Availability of general campus facilities and overall ambience

The university blends harmoniously with nature, featuring lush greenery across the campus. Each program begins with the symbolic act of watering a sapling, highlighting its commitment to sustainability. The campus is equipped with solar panels and rainwater harvesting systems. Accessibility is prioritized through ramps for the Divyang community and battery-operated vehicles for on-campus transport.

Residential facilities include separate hostels for male and female students, as well as accommodations for faculty, officers, and staff. Two guest houses serve VIPs and general visitors. Students benefit from subsidized meals in canteens, along with transportation, medical services, sports facilities, a children's park, and an amenities center.

The university operates Betar Vidyasagar, a community radio station (FM 90.8) and internet radio, airing academic and cultural programs, research updates, health awareness, farming awareness, PM-PRANAM schemes, news, and weather. A power sub-station ensures 24/7 electricity, supported by DG sets, along with WiFi, CCTV surveillance, and fire safety systems.

University auditorium, the Vivekananda Sabhagriha seats over 1,000, complemented by an open-air stage for cultural activities. An annual food festival involves all stakeholders and showcases local cuisine prepared by students, faculty, and staff. Banking facilities, ATMs, and a post office enhance convenience for residents.

4.2 - Library as a Learning Resource

4.2.1 - Library is automated using Integrated Library Management System (ILMS) and has digitisation facility

The Central Library has been fully automated using the integrated library management software "Koha" since 2018. Initially automated in 2001 with "SOUL 1.0," it was later upgraded to "SOUL 2.0" in 2017. To enhance user experience, RFID technology has been introduced, featuring RFID-enabled self-check-in/out kiosks and a capacitive touch screen integrated with the ILMS via the SIP2 protocol. RFID technology also ensures security through Electronic Article Surveillance (EAS) gates utilizing security bit-enabled TAGs.

Self-service kiosks are conveniently located on the Ground Floor of the library. Users can access OPAC and other resources through the Library Portal linked to the university's website, which provides a wide range of e-resources, including electronic books, journals, and databases. Full-text e-resources are accessible via campus-connected devices such as PCs, laptops, and gadgets. Additionally, remote access to subscribed e-resources is available through MyLOFT for faculty, officers, research scholars, and project fellows.

The library features a mini data center with six rack servers hosting over 12 virtual servers. Unified storage manages data from various systems, while NAS storage supports CCTV data. A dedicated computer lab, the "Centre for Digital Resource Service" (CDRS), offers e-resource services for students and scholars.

The university boasts a cutting-edge smart campus with advanced ICT infrastructure and services, continuously updated according to the "Vidyasagar University IT POLICY, Rules and Regulations 2.0." The campus features approximately 10 servers, 2 mini data centers with virtual computing, 1177 desktops, 210 laptops, 35 VoIP devices, 134 IP CCTV cameras, 5 NVR, 12 biometric devices, video conferencing equipment, and digital notice boards. These IT resources are interconnected via a campus-wide LAN and Wi-Fi network (with 250 no. of AP). The university enjoys 1Gbps NKN internet connectivity.

The university employs a biometric attendance system and a Leave/HR Management System for all employees. It has a dedicated software development cell that caters to regular and new application software needs, developing various e-governance modules on demand.

The physical IT infrastructure and facilities are regularly updated and upgraded as needed. Desktops and peripheral devices are replaced with new purchases as they become obsolete. The campus LAN and Wi-Fi are consistently expanded and upgraded, maintained centrally by the Computer Centre. The university's IT budget for the year 2023-24 is ₹1.393 crore.

- The University's Maintenance Committee ensures the efficient upkeep of buildings, classrooms, and laboratories through regular inspections. A dedicated in-house team maintains hygiene, cleanliness, and infrastructure, with a full-time gardener managing the campus greenery.
- Annual Maintenance Contracts (AMCs) cover a range of assets, including generators, air conditioners, ICT infrastructure (IT gadgets, campus LAN, Wi-Fi, digital accessories), CCTV cameras, and water purifiers. The Computer Centre, following the University's IT policy, manages all ICT infrastructure, supported by trained in-house electricians and plumbers.

- **Parking facilities are well-organized, with surveillance cameras monitoring campus activities. The maintenance team maintains and verifies stock registers for all equipment, and annual pest control ensures the longevity of library books and records. The Senior University Engineer and team oversee civil and electrical maintenance across the campus.**
- **Sports facilities are meticulously managed by the Sports Committee under the Advisory Committee of the Sports Board. Separate gyms for boys and girls are maintained through AMCs. Two dedicated groundsmen ensure the year-round readiness of sports grounds for state and national events. This comprehensive approach reflects the University's commitment to maintaining a functional, clean, and well-equipped environment.**

Decentralization and participative management are central to the institutional practices at Vidyasagar University. Key governing bodies, including the Court, Executive Council (EC), Faculty Council for Post Graduate Studies, Board of Studies, and Departmental Committees - all have specific statutory roles and functions. The Court serves as the apex body, ratifying major academic and

administrative decisions presented during EC meetings.

The Faculty Council for Post Graduate Studies includes the heads of all academic departments and senior professors, ensuring comprehensive representation. Departmental Committees play a vital role in managing daily departmental activities, while the role of Board of Studies (both UG and PG) is crucial for academic governance, preparing lists of paper setters, examiners, and moderators for examination processes. The Ph.D. Committee comprising internal and external members ensures quality research undertaken by the scholars.

Additionally, the Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) fosters dignity and self-respect among stakeholders, addressing gender discrimination and promoting gender sensitization. The university also has the Equal Opportunity Cell and SC-ST Complaint Cell. Representatives from the Teachers Association and Non-teaching Staff participate in important committees, and alumni and industry representatives contribute to syllabus formulation. Students are also included in various committees, such as the ICC and the NSS.

Teaching-Learning and Evaluation

Vidyasagar University is committed to delivering high-quality education for postgraduate and doctoral programs. It strictly follows an academic calendar that outlines essential activities such as compulsory classroom teaching, tutorials, continuous internal assessments, and end-semester examinations. Each student has a Research Advisory Committee (RAC) that periodically evaluates their research progress, ensuring a structured approach to academic growth.

Research and Development

Faculty members are encouraged to engage in Faculty Development Programs (FDPs), workshops, seminars, and conferences, enhancing their professional development. They actively share research findings at national and international forums, with publications in SCOPUS and Web of Science indexed journals. The university also supports the submission of project proposals to various funding agencies and the university publishes UGC Care-listed journals, newsletters, and wall magazines.

Green Initiatives on Campus

Vidyasagar University emphasizes sustainability through various green initiatives. Collaborating with the NSS cell, it promotes a plastic-free campus and observes Forest Week for environmental awareness. There is a tradition of watering newly planted trees during ceremonies, and outside vehicle entry is limited once a week to reduce air pollution. The university maintains natural water bodies, ensures effective waste management and wastewater recycling, and designates feeding areas for local wildlife on campus.

The university follows self-sustainability model to generate Physical and Financial resources. A large portion of required funds

is collected in the form of various fees from the affiliated colleges of the University; income from Interest on Fixed Deposit/ Savings; various fees collected from the postgraduate students and researchers of the university; Consultancy fees; income from overhead funds of different Projects; proceeds from sales of the publications of the Vidyasagar University Publication Division. The University provides financial support for organising Conferences / Special Lectures and Workshops. The registration fee from the participants for the add-on courses was spent under different heads of the development of the University. Moreover, the University receives limited funds from various funding agencies like RUSA, UGC, DST, DBT, TEQIP etc.

Optimal utilization of resources:

1. Purchases above Rs. 5 lakhs will be decided in the Central Purchase Committee.
2. For direct purchases without any tender/quotation by the Pl/Coordinator, the existing ceiling limit of Rs.10,000/- is increased to Rs. 25,000/- for other than State Government or University funding.
3. Various committees like Technical Committee, Purchase Committee, Sales Committee, Finance Committee, Executive Council etc. are constituted to make policies, take decisions and accord sanctions for effective utilization of funds.

6.5.1 - Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) has contributed significantly for institutionalizing the quality assurance strategies and processes by constantly reviewing the teaching learning process, structures & methodologies of operations and learning outcomes at periodic intervals

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) at Vidyasagar University has made a significant contribution to enhancing academic quality and research. The IQAC implemented a system to monitor syllabus completion across all semesters, requiring departments to submit reports on classes allotted, conducted, and the percentage of syllabus covered. The cell also tracked course and program outcomes to ensure alignment with NEP guidelines and worked with the Secretary of the PG Councils to monitor student attendance, fostering accountability. In addition, the IQAC led the development of e-content for postgraduate courses, prepared 31 video lectures and uploaded them to the university's ILMS. The IQAC played a key role in revising the postgraduate syllabus, incorporating UGC guidelines on gender, environment, professional ethics, and values, with input from faculty, alumni, and industrialists. The cell also organized capacity-building programs, such as orientation sessions for research scholars, faculty members, and a national seminar on Quality Research and Teaching for HEIs. Furthermore, the IQAC took a proactive role in signing 16 MoUs with universities, research institutes, and industries. IQAC introduced awards for research and publication, which helped increase the number of quality publications. Detailed records of these initiatives are maintained at the IQAC office, showcasing the university's commitment to continuous academic improvement.

The International Women's Day Celebration on 11th March 2024 featured Anita Agnihotri, who discussed women's struggle for human rights, highlighting Bilkis Bano, Medha Patkar, Gauri Lankesh, and Kamala Bhasin, with 200 participants attending. Additionally, napkin vending machines were installed at four key locations to ensure hygiene accessibility. These initiatives reinforce a safe, inclusive, and empowering environment for women on campus.

7.2 - Best Practices

7.2.1 - Describe two best practices successfully implemented by the Institution as per NAAC format provided in the Manual.

Two best practices of the University:

1. Research and Publication Award

Vidyasagar University introduced the Research and Publication Award in 2021 to encourage faculty in research, quality publications, patents, projects, and e-content development. Faculty are recognized under Platinum, Gold, and Silver categories based on points for SCOPUS/Web of Science/PubMed-indexed publications, book authorship, patents, Ph.D. supervision, and ILMS content creation. A committee evaluates applications, and awardees receive Rs. 5000, Rs. 10,000, or Rs. 15,000. In 2023, 42 faculty members were awarded. Challenges include refining criteria for humanities, increasing faculty participation, securing funding, and promoting awareness. The initiative strengthens the university's research ecosystem.

2. Matrishakti: Sharad Samman

Matrishakti: Sharad Samman, initiated by Vidyasagar University, celebrates Durga Puja as a symbol of women's empowerment and

cultural heritage, recognized by UNESCO as an Intangible Cultural Heritage. The program honors Durga Puja committees in Midnapore and nearby rural areas, promoting artistic excellence, local artisans, and sustainability. Registered pujas are evaluated by Betar Vidyasagar's expert panel based on theme, idol design, environmental consciousness, and safety measures. Results are announced via FM 90.8 and social media. In 2023, 22 puja committees participated, with 14 receiving awards. The initiative fosters community engagement, cultural preservation, and environmental awareness.

Betar Vidyasagar: The Voice of Vidyasagar University

Betar Vidyasagar FM 90.8 MHz is the community radio station of Vidyasagar University, dedicated to serving the local community since 2021. Approved by the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting, Government of India, it is the second community radio station in the HEIs in West Bengal. It broadcasts educational, cultural, and awareness programs for students and the surrounding rural community, encouraging active participation from the university members.

The journey of Betar Vidyasagar began on 26.09.2020, initially covering a 15 km radius, primarily benefiting tribal and rural populations. Over time, with the help of social media, its reach has expanded globally. The station has hosted several renowned personalities, including Ajay Chakraborty, Pratul Mukhopadhyay, Rupankar Bagchi, Sameek Bandopadhyay, and many more.

Betar Vidyasagar broadcasts in Bengali, Santali, Hindi, Sanskrit, and English, offering diverse programs such as 'Subhasitaboli' (wise sayings), 'Swastha Katha' (health awareness), Krishi Pathshala (agriculture), 'Manishider Katha' (eminent personalities), news,

drama, music, and sports updates. The annual Puja Parikrama successfully covers Durga Puja celebrations in Medinipur and nearby rural areas. Operating six days a week (except Mondays) from 11 AM to 4 PM, Betar Vidyasagar remains a strong platform for education, culture, and community engagement.
